If you only need the buying answer: the current print listing is the strongest clean route in this snapshot. The sampled lifetime eTextbook is much higher, while the other rows are in non-USD currencies and are less useful as direct decision anchors. For a compact Q&A review book that is designed to be revisited, the current print price is already easy to justify.

What this book actually teaches

Essentials of Aesthetic Surgery Q&A Companion is a focused review book built around board-style questioning, quick recall, and targeted revision in aesthetic surgery. Its value is not in replacing a full operative atlas. It matters because it helps trainees and early-career surgeons identify weak areas, sharpen pattern recognition, and rehearse high-yield knowledge efficiently.

Question-and-answer companions behave differently from conventional textbooks. Readers often return to them repeatedly in short sessions before exams, before cases, or during periodic refreshers. That use pattern gives a compact print copy more value than a one-time read might suggest.

Why print makes sense here

The current print listing is lower than the sampled lifetime eTextbook, which is already enough to change the conversation. When the keepable physical copy is also the cheaper clean route, print stops being a luxury format and becomes the more practical

way to hold onto a reusable review tool.

I would lean toward print for fellows, residents, and aesthetic-surgery readers who expect to come back to question-based review more than once. The only real argument against ownership would be a very short review window with another dependable copy already available nearby.
