If you only need the buying answer, Pearson+ digital access is still the cheapest short-term route, but the current Merybook hardcover is strong enough to justify ownership. It sits well below the sampled used-hardcover market and far below long-term digital access, so the right decision depends on whether you need a one-term solution or a lasting technical reference.

## Current price comparison

This is not a case where digital makes print look irrational. The 180-day route is cheaper if you only need temporary access, but the current hardcover still undercuts the sampled used-print market and looks much better than paying for long-term digital access. For a technical subject that often gets revisited later, that matters.

## What this book actually teaches

*Fire Dynamics* is a systems book. Students are trying to understand ignition, combustion, heat release, plume behavior, fire growth, testing, and heat transfer as connected processes rather than isolated definitions. The hard part of this kind of course is that the concepts only begin to make sense after students have worked through graphs, calculations, and cause-and-effect relationships more than once.

That is exactly why format matters. A technical fire-science text becomes more useful when readers can mark formulas, tag diagrams, compare chapters, and come back later with better mathematical maturity or more field context. If the book will only be

used for one term, digital may be enough. If it is going to remain part of later fire investigation, protection, or engineering study, hardcover becomes much easier to defend.

## **Who should buy hardcover and who should not**

Buy hardcover if you are in fire science, protection, or investigation and expect to reuse the subject after the class ends. At the current market gap, ownership is a serious option rather than a luxury.

Do not buy hardcover if you only need short-term access for one course window and cost is your main constraint. The 180-day Pearson+ option is the cheaper route for that narrower use case.
