Occupational therapy students meet evidence-based thinking more than once, and methods, measurement, and interpretation often return in later practice-oriented work. That is what gives ownership a real case even when rental is much cheaper in the short run.

What this book actually teaches

Kielhofner's Research in Occupational Therapy is built around methods of inquiry that support practice. It helps readers understand how research is designed, measured, interpreted, and used to strengthen occupational-therapy reasoning. The book's real importance is not just that it teaches research vocabulary, but that it helps students connect evidence to practice questions.

That linkage between inquiry and practice is why many OT students end up wanting a durable reference later. Still, if the book is only for one early methods requirement, rental remains the cleaner economic choice.

When hardcover is worth keeping

If you only need short-term access, rental wins easily. If you know research literacy and evidence-based OT practice will stay central to your training, the hardcover becomes more reasonable because it is still cheaper than the sampled buy and eTextbook alternatives.
