If you only need the buying answer: the current hardcover listing is the strongest clean print route in this snapshot. The sampled Walmart, rental, and new-hardcover comparators all come in higher. I am not using the questionable currency-marked digital row as the decision anchor here, so the honest conclusion is that the current hardcover is already competitively priced for a specialist legal-history title.

What this book actually teaches

Searching for Justice After the Holocaust is a specialist work on restitution, legal redress, postwar justice, and the long afterlife of Holocaust-era theft and dispossession. The book matters because it connects legal process, moral repair, historical memory, and institutional failure in a way that simple survey accounts do not. It is as much about the structure of delayed justice as it is about any single case.

That makes it useful well beyond one course. Readers in Holocaust studies, transitional justice, restitution law, and human-rights history often need to return to this material when questions of redress, documentation, and legal responsibility reappear in new contexts.

Why the hardcover makes sense here

In the clean print comparisons sampled, the current hardcover is already the low point. That matters because books in this area often behave more like long-horizon references than disposable class texts. When the keepable copy is already below the other sampled print routes, ownership becomes much easier to defend.

I would lean toward the hardcover for legal historians, human-rights scholars, and graduate readers who expect to return to restitution and postwar justice debates. I would only avoid ownership if your need is very brief and library access already covers the book reliably.
