Print only becomes unnecessary if you know you will never come back to research appraisal after the course ends.

Books in this lane are most valuable when they help a student bridge the gap between research literacy and practice reasoning.

That is why ownership can make sense here even when a cheaper used copy exists. Students in occupational therapy, rehabilitation, and allied-health fields often meet evidence-based practice more than once. The ideas return in later clinical reasoning, capstones, and professional decision-making, so a book like this can keep earning value after the original assignment is over.

When print is worth buying and when it is not

If the priority is absolute lowest cost, the used route wins. If you want a new copy to annotate and keep, the current print listing is more appealing than the eTextbook because it is cheaper and easier to revisit without licensing limits. If this is a one-course requirement and you do not expect to come back to evidence appraisal, even the new print copy may be more than you need.
